- County-month dataset of Freedmen's Bureau schools and educational attainments of formerly enslaved people across the Reconstruction South from 1865-1870
- Includes microdata coded from 5000+ archival teachers' reports on attendance and instruction, disaggregated by subject and gender at the school-month level

Developing World Refugee and Asylum Policy (DWRAP)

- Data on all laws related to forced migration for 92 developing world countries in Africa, the Middle East, and Central/South Asia from 1951 to 2017
- Currently expanding coverage to Latin America and Southeast Asia
- With Guy Grossman and Jeremy M. Weinstein

Militant Group Alliances and Relationships (MGAR)

- Data on material and rhetorical relationships between 2,613 militant groups from 1950 to 2016
- With Erica Chenoweth, Michael C. Horowitz, Evan Perkoski, and Philip B.K. Potter

U.S. Coast Guard Migrant and Drug Interdictions, 1995-2017

- Georeferenced data, obtained through Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests, for all U.S. Coast Guard stops resulting in migrant or drug seizures
